

CoronaVirus Strategic Meeting


As soon as the CDC began making recommendations for keeping schools and communities safe, we convened our full time staff to begin brainstorming a strategic plan for how best to support schools knowing a "Shelter in Place" policy was inevitable. It became very clear that distance learning and virtual classrooms were going to be the new delivery models for arts integration to continue in these dire times. ArtsNow staff created a 4 week plan, an 8 week plan, and a plan that would carry us through the end of the school year (if needed) so that we could continue supporting districts, schools, families, students, teachers, and communities. Chestnut Family Foundation


